### This week in the library by Ms Storms, librarian

Last week in the library I reminded children how easy it is to pick the right book to read every time. This method is called the five-finger method. Children start by finding a book they might be interested in by reading the title and the blurb (the explanation on the back of the book). Then they turn to a random page in the book and read it. For every word that they don't know, they should hold up a finger.

We use the following guidelines according to how many fingers they hold up:

0 or 1 – This book is probably too easy.

2 or 3 – This book is probably a choice that will give a reasonable challenge. Children might need some help with unfamiliar words. Help can be a dictionary, teachers, older siblings, you!

- 4 This book is probably too difficult for now but what about reading it together?
- 5 This book is most probably too advanced; try a different one for now.

Helping children select the right book allows reading for pleasure to become part of their daily lives. I hope you get to enjoy a book with your children this week.
