This week's picture book is Tilda Tries Again by Tom Percival. It is all about the perseverance, and the message within the book applies to adults as well as children! Please ask your child about the book and what happened when Tilda tried again.
Perseverance is something we sometimes need when we are reading at home with children. It's not always straightforward to know how to really help children become strong readers so it's easy to overlook reading at home, especially when we are all so busy. Please stick with it; over the next few weeks I will offer some questions to ask as you read with your children, so everyone gets more out of the experience.
Asking questions before you even start the book really helps get focused. Ask your children...

- What is the title of the book?
- Who is the author/illustrator?
- Can you look at the pictures and predict what you think will happen in the book?
- What characters do you think might be in this story?
- Is this book like any other books you've read before?
- Why?
