This week in the library by Ms Storms, librarian

This week I will share some questions you can ask children about the characters in the stories they are reading. Getting to know characters is a vital part of reading for understanding and for pleasure, and it helps children learn more about different people.

To understand characters in a story, start with the basics:

What is the character's name?
Do they go by any other names?

Then you can move on to physical characteristics:

How old is the character?
How tall are they?
What colour is their hair?
What colour is are their eyes?
What does their voice sound like?
How do they dress?
Do they have any scars, birthmarks, or tattoos?
What language do they speak?

Then talk about the character's biographical information:

Where was this character born?
Where were they raised?
Where do they live now?
What does their house look like?
Where do they go to school or work?
What do we know about their family?

Then think about personality characteristics:

What is their personality like?
Are they nice or mean to others in the story?
What makes this character happy or sad?
What is their temperament?
Are they easy going or do they get cross or easily frustrated?
What are their hobbies?

Lastly, think about their story:

What is this character going through?
What are they trying to do?
Do they go through any changes?
What did they learn in this story?

You can use a mix of these questions as you read a story together, or pick one theme to focus on each time you read.

However you use these questions, keep up the good reading!
